DESPITE RECENT rumours to the contrary, cerebral palsy sufferer Graham Henderson's gardening business is flourishing as it enters its third year. The 22-year-old Montrosian had been unwell towards the end of last year and, with his presence from the town's gardens clearly missed, folk speculated as to what had happened to the business.

Now, fighting fit again, Graham hopes to branch out to other Angus towns as he has recently been presented with a new motor mower by the Disabled Advisory Service, which has already ensured him the "contract" of junior side Montrose Vics FC.

Graham's muscle-flexing is not confined to his business. Just a fortnight ago he moved from his parents' home in Borrowfield Crescent to his new address in Christies Lane. His parents, Richard and Olive, do still, however, provide a lot of help.

Graham has always tried to ignore the effects of cerebral palsy and had always been intent on launching his own business.

After two years as a YTS trainee gardener working in National Trust gardens he took a month-long business course through the Dundee Enterprise Trust. Since setting up on his he has received support from the Arbroath Venture Trust.
